THE SECOND INJURY TIME-OUT

Rule Interpretations Compiled by Bill Welker, EdD WVSSAC Rules Clinician/Interpreter

What should be called and what choices are offered after the following second injury time-out situations for *Wrestler A*:

1. After the second period of the regulation match when **Wrestler A** had choice the second period:

Wrestler B will have choice to start the third period and choice of position at the start of all overtime periods if the match goes to overtime.

- 2. After the third period of the regulation match and match is tied: Wrestler B will have choice of position at the start of the Sudden Victory period and the start of the remaining overtime periods (tiebreakers).
- 3. After the one-minute overtime period with match tied:

 Wrestler B will have choice of position at the start of the remaining overtime periods (tiebreakers).
- 4. After the first tiebreaker period when **Wrestler A** had choice the first tiebreaker period:

Wrestler B will have choice of position at the start of the remaining overtime periods (tiebreakers).

- 5. After the second tiebreaker with match tied:

 Wrestler B will have choice at the start of the remaining overtime periods (tiebreakers).
- 6. Both **Wrestler A** and **Wrestler B** ask for second injury time-out simultaneously anytime during the match:

The rules book really does not address this situation. I would say that the referee should try and make a judgment call as to who to who took the injury time-out first (Wrestler A lets say). Now the opponent takes a 2^{nd} injury time-out (Wrestler B). In this situation, the person who was granted the 2nd injury time-out last (Wrestler B) will not have choice and thus Wrestler A would have choice on the restart and at the start of each period for the remainder of the match.
